Research Forum at the 11th European Summer School Ravensbrück 2016

Camps in the Twentieth Century. Labor, Repression and Forced Migration from the Perspective of Gender History

The 11th European Summer School Ravensbrück will be focusing on camps in the twentieth century – as sites of exclusion, extreme social and political control and as places of violence – from the perspective of Gender History.

Dates: Sunday, August 28th – Friday, September 2nd 2016

Venue: Ravensbrück Memorial Site, Straße der Nationen, 16798 Fürstenberg

The European Summer School 2016 will focus on the following topics. Each topic will be analyzed and discussed from the perspective of Gender History:

- Forced Labor in Camps – (Re)Education, Terror and Extermination
- Forms and Functions of Repression in Camps
- Forced Migration and Forcible Displacement to Camps

The European Summer School welcomes participants from the regions of Berlin and Brandenburg, from across Germany and from abroad, including students and early career academics, teachers, those involved in museums and other forms of public educational work and interested members of the public.

For a Research Forum on Monday, August 29th we are looking for early career academics who work on topics related to this year's summer school or the history of the former Women's Concentration Camp Ravensbrück and who would like to present their research project.

Applications for the Research Forum should include a short synopsis and a CV. The closing date is July 15th 2016. The presentation can be given in either English or German. An allowance will be provided.
